Joe Martinez's Dragon 1/35th scale M2 Half Track

Our May was another great meeting, well attended and with many excellent models to show. It also set a milestone. Our first meeting as an IPMS/USA affiliated club was in May 1970 so this meeting was the start of our 56<sup>th</sup> year. I have missed no more than three meetings in that time span. One by choice. Two because I was travelling with family.

We next meet on Sunday, June 1, 7000 Edgemere. 2:00 P.M.

Following is the information provided by Joe Martinez on his model on page 1 of this issue.

The rolled tarp on the right front fender was made with Tamiya epoxy putty. The straps were made with masking tape, and the buckles were from ABER.

The folded camouflage net on the left front fender was made of gauze and the straps were masking tape as described above. He attached the .30 cal tripod as well. The .50 cal mg tripod was attached



to the left



rear of the body, and the straps were masking tape and photo etch. He added the 2 musette bags from the spares box. The gear rack on the rear of the half-track was scratch built from Evergreen strips. He added the ration boxes and bed rolls from his spares box. The shovel was provided in the kit. When painting, he used Tamiya primer and Lifeguard Olive Drab. The Earth yellow was from AK. He used filters from Mig and oils for the wash, dust and stains as well as pigments for the dust and mud.

Circle Star markings were painted using stencils provided by Fabian Nevarez. He modified one of the M1919 machine guns by adding the water-cooling jacket. He added the retaining chain to the tow pintle from ABER. The lube order on the assistant driver's door



was made from Tamiya tape and painted. Joe replaced the



antenna pedestal and mount with a 3-D printed item by Fabian. The antenna is stretched sprue. The tie-down clip was made from a bit metal. The tide-down cord was made from .005 rigging line by USCHI. As stated, before the musette bags, plus the ammo cans and the steel helmet were added from the spars box. Joe added cable to the

radio amp and to the power amp. He fabricated the microphone with the cable for the radio. The dash gauges and placards and those for the radio came from Archer's Half-track radio set.
