Our club is a chartered chapter of the International Plastic Model Society - U.S. Branch (the IPMS-USA). The EPSMS was first organized in 1969, received its charter in 1970, and has been continuously active since that time.

We are a non-profit organization dedicated to promoting the art of scale modeling (regardless of construction media), and membership is open to anyone interested in scale modeling. Club membership dues are payable on an annual basis (we can accept cash or personal checks). Dues are \$15.00 per year for regular members over the age of 16, and are based on a January-December club year. Junior memberships are available for those aged 16 and under, and are priced at \$5.00 per year. Family memberships are available for an extra payment of \$2.00 per year per family member. Members in good standing are entitled to vote in all club matters, run for office, enter club contests, judge in all club contests, and receive a copy of the club's monthly newsletter. Hal's Hobby Warehouse on Bessemer in East El Paso also offers club members a discount on purchases of models and modeling materials. The exact discount is set on a sliding scale. Our club meetings are generally held on the 1st or 2nd Sunday of each month at 2.00 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall of St. Paul's United Methodist Church at 7000 Edgemere Blvd (please see the map below). Schedule changes are published ahead of time in the newsletter.

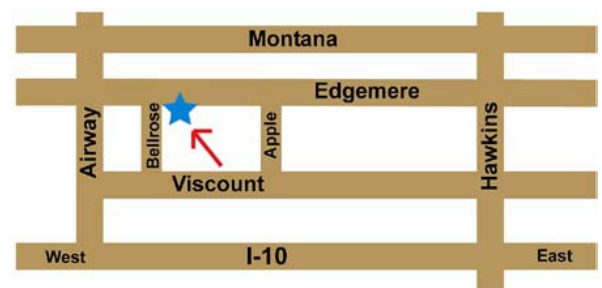

Carlos Delgado had an Me109F which started out as a Twenty First Century toy in 1/32nd scale.

Paul Carr had an interesting Diorama made up of a PA-18 Super Cub in 1/48th scale. Paul used the Minicraft kit and found a figure set in 1/48th scale from Pegasus Hobbies. The trees appeared to be from some of the model railroad supplies available. Nice work and it reminds me of a trip to Wisconsin some years back when near Princeton, WI, I saw a Stearman giving rides from a grass strip with trees at one end very similar to what Paul had shown.

Jim Davis had two nice 1/72nd B-25's built as "strafters." One was an Italeri B-25D from the 501 BS, called "Little Thumper." The other was an Italeri B-25G "TeeKay" from the 823 BS, 38th BG based in New Guinea, 1944.

Jose Roldan brought a model of the Flying Sub in 1/123rd scale. He also had a 1/72nd Claude A5M built from the Hobby Boss kit.

Carl Webster brought an AFV kit of a (German spelling) Wiesel Mk 20 in 1/35th scale. Another kit was a Wiesel Tow, 1/35th scale as a WIP. His M551 was built

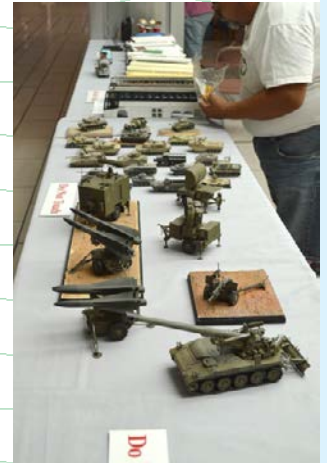


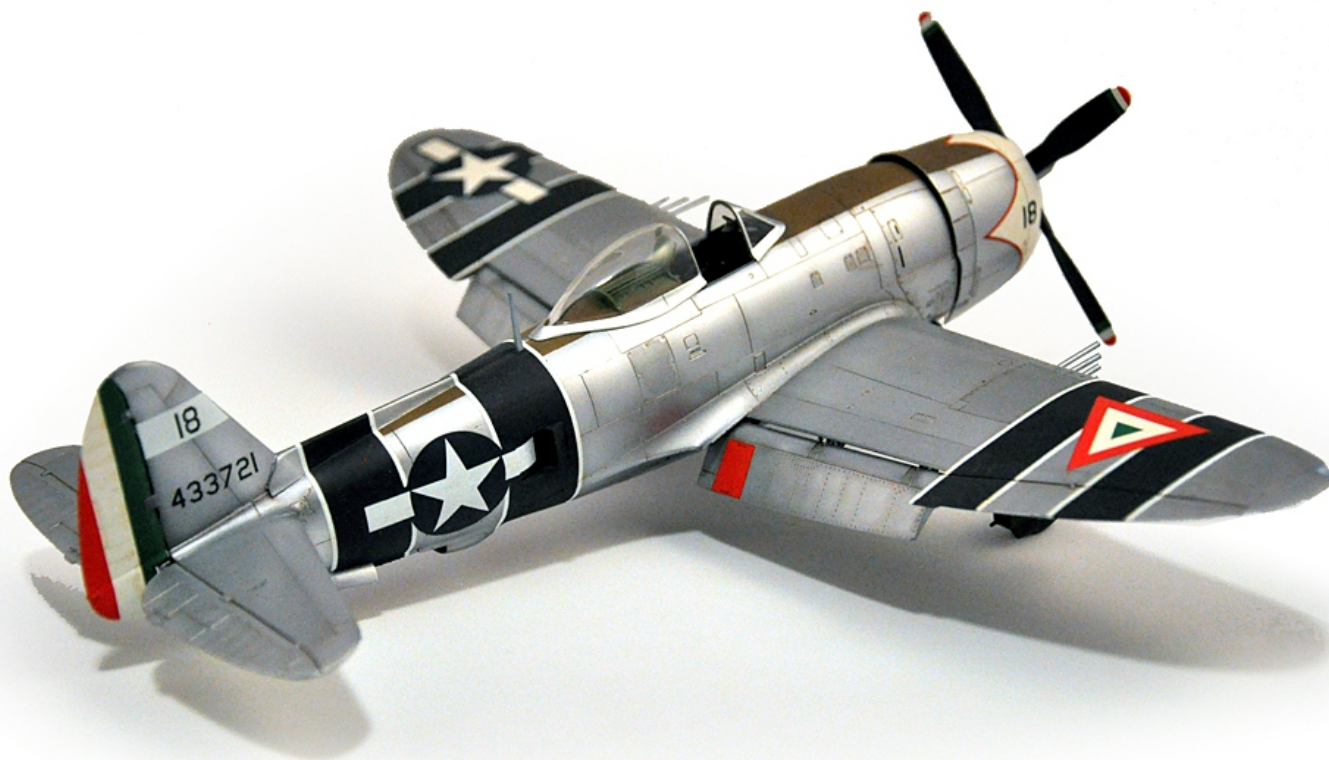
