
We are a non-profit organization dedicated to promoting the art of scale modeling (regardless of construction media), and membership is open to anyone interested in scale modeling. Club membership dues are payable on an annual basis (we can accept cash or personal checks). Dues are \$15.00 per year for regular members over the age of 16, and are based on a January-December club year. Junior memberships are available for those aged 16 and under, and are priced at \$5.00 per year. Family memberships are available for an extra payment of \$2.00 per year per family member. Members in good standing are entitled to vote in all club matters, run for office, enter club contests, judge in all club contests, and receive a copy of the club's monthly newsletter. Hal's Hobby Warehouse on Bessemer in East El Paso also offers club members a discount on purchases of models and modeling materials. The exact discount is set on a sliding scale. Our club meetings are generally held on the 1 st or 2nd Sunday of each month at 2.00 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall of St. Paul's United Methodist Church at 7000 Edgemere Blvd (please see the map below). Mike Garcia had 13 ship models placed on the flag of the country of origin. Most were in 1/350 scale and made an attractive display.


Jose c. Diaz had 15 of his paper scratch built bus models, a trap set and 1 car to show. Unique.

We have several pictures with no info provided. I will try and guess. What they are and to whom they might belong.

Jim Davis had three F-4 Phantoms. The F-4D was built from the Fujimi kit and was marked as 906 TFG 89TFS "30th Anniversary" based at Wright Patterson AFB. His F-4E and F-4G were both from the 90th TFS 3TFW based ag Clark AFB, Philippine Islands circa 1980. The F-4E was a Fujimi kit and the F-4G was a Testor's release of the Italeri kit, I think.

Jose C. Diaz had as work in progress a Dina Marcopolo Viaggio Coach in 1/32nd scale. He also had a Chihuahuenses bus. These are scratch built from foam board and paper.

Carlos Delgado had a Tamiya /48th scale Lancaster and a 1/35th T-55 tank built from the Lindberg kit.

Michael Garcia had a 1/350 scale Ukuru as a WIP.

Richard Macias had a Revell F-14D, a Hasegawa Ki-84 Hayate and an Italeri F-22 all in 1/48th scale.



Jose Patino had a Hiller H-13 in 1/32nd scale. It seems like Revell might have done this kit.

Gustav Hebrok had a Revell 1/48th scale Pt-17as a work in progress.

Joseph Roper had an Academy 1/72nd scale M3 halftrack converted to an Israeli
