Carl Webster was back with a boat load of armor to show. You will see in the pictures, two Tiger I tanks, one in 1/35th scale, the other in 1/144. These are painted in the same camouflage. Some neat stuff here and he did another 1/144th scale Tiger I in the early gray scheme. Carl usually does some sort of conversion to his armor pieces, in both 1/35th scale an in 1/72nd scale. He had a Dragon M3A3 marked for the OFI with armor added to the completed kit. Carl brought two other kits to the meeting, one still in the box and the other as a work in progress.

Aircraft Models

Jim Davis had a FJ-3 Fury kit bashed with a Grand Phoenix FJ-4B nose grafted onto the fuselage of an ESCI FJ-2/3 . Jim stated that the ESCI nose is way too narrow and looks more line a standard F-86 nose. Some nice work from Jim, once again.

Michael King had a couple of nice 1/72nd models to show. He had a Photo Recon Spitfire in PRU pink. He listed it as Mk IX but I think the Special Hobbies kit is a Mk XI. Interesting note: After researching the Special Hobbies kit, it shows to be a Mark X and comes with the PRU Pink as a recommended scheme. If I am wrong, my apologies to Mike. His other effort was a very nice Italeri CH-47 D in the Falklands Conflict markings. Some more nice work on our tables for the month of June.

Duane Velasquez brought a couple of MiG 15 models to show. One was from DML(Dragon) and the other the HobbyCraft kit. These were in 1/72nd scale and one was finished in camouflage and the other in an all silver finish. These looked pretty nice. Well done, Duane.


We are a non-profit organization dedicated to promoting the art of scale modeling (regardless of construction media), and membership is open to anyone interested in scale modeling. Club membership dues are payable on an annual basis (we can accept cash or personal checks). Dues are \$15.00 per year for regular members over the age of 16, and are based on a January-December club year. Junior memberships are available for those age 16 and under, and are priced at \$5.00 per year. Family memberships are available for an extra payment of \$2.00 per year per family member. Members in good standing are entitled to vote in all club matters, run for office, enter club contests, judge in all club contests, and receive a copy of the club's monthly newsletter. Hal's Hobby Warehouse on Bessemer in East El Paso also offers club members a discount on purchased of models and modeling materials. The exact discount is set on a sliding scale. Our club meeting are generally held on the 1st or 2nd Sunday of each month at 2:00 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall of St. Paul's Methodist Church at 7000 Edgemere Blvd (please see map below). Schedule changes are published ahead of time in the newsletter. We normally hold either one or two model contest at each club meeting, one against a specific modeling or historical theme, and one that is open competition for anything a modeler wishes to bring.
