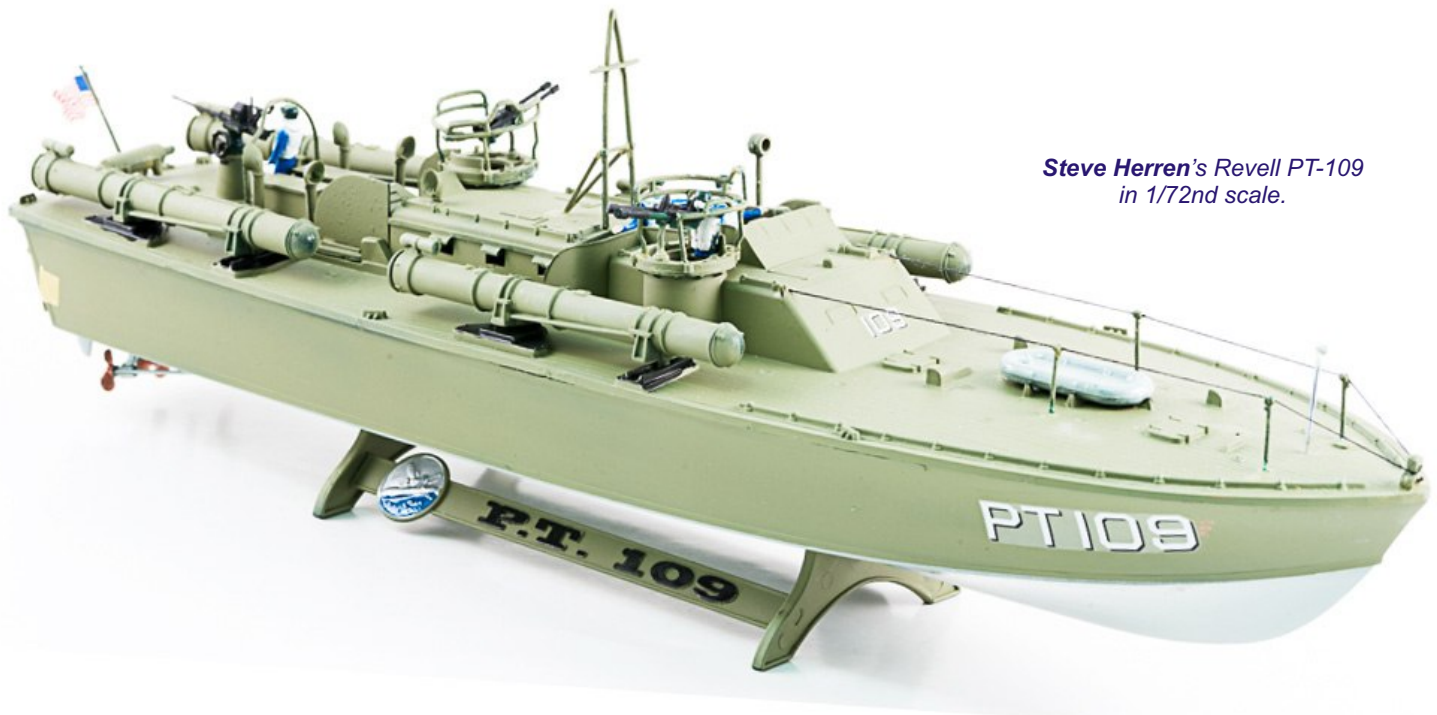

Julio Sanchez has as a Work in Progress, a 1/32nd scale F7F TigerCat. This a scratch built vac u form and he had the molds he used to form the fuselage, engine nacelles and cowlings. Outstanding work, all around.

Fabian Nevarez had his Hobby Boss F4U-4 finished as a Navy Reserve aircraft from Olathe, Kansas. I had the privilege of seeing this effort from start to finish and then also had a chance to see it on HyperScale Plastic Pixs. Mike King brought a number of aircraft to show. He has been pretty busy, as these were all newly finished by Mike. He had a Monogram 1/72nd scale P-36A in the scheme used by the Army Air Corps in Hawaii, December 1941. All the other models were British in nature and included a Hawker Sea Hurricane Mk 2C, a Spitfire Mk XVI, "Bubble Top" built from the Heller kit. Another of his Spitfires was a Mk VIII tropical and a Spitfire PR Mk X or XI.

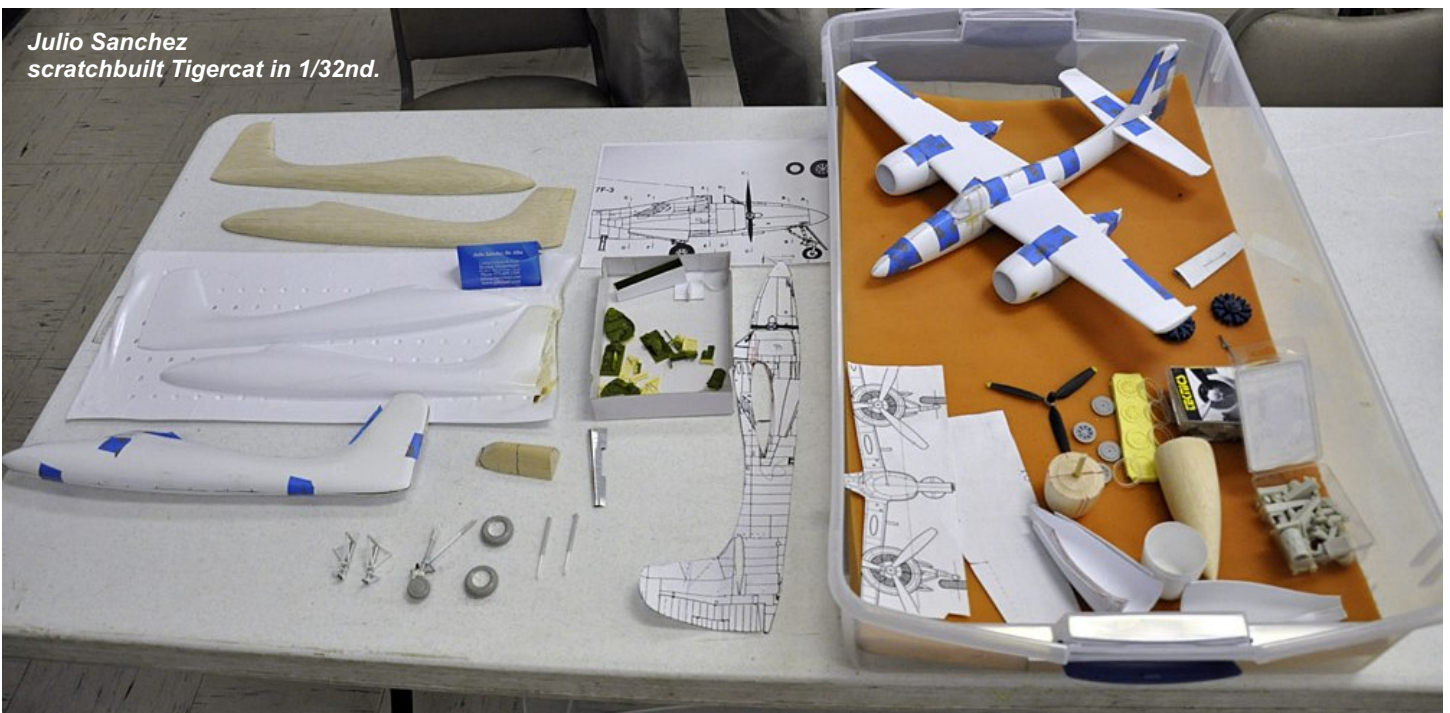

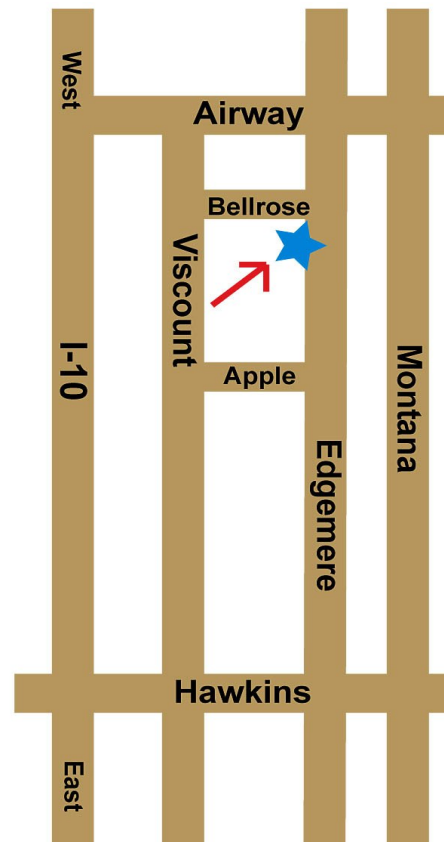
