Phoenix and River Villa brought some cinnamon rolls for the members to show their appreciation for past favors granted. Thanks, guys.






Vincien Kennedy's 747



ON THE TABLES AND PHOTOGRAPHED

Arthur Berdick had four 1/35th scale military models to show. He had A Dodge Staff Car WC56 built from the Italeri kit; an M728 Combat Engineers Vehicle using the AFV kit; An M1046 Humvee with TOW missile by Tamiya and a Soviet B-4 M1931 203mm Howitzer also from AFV.

Jack Callaway had a Tamiya Douglas F4D in 1/48th scale.

Jim Davis brought a Hobby Boss 1/72nd scale Mitsubishi A5M Claude. The W on the fin indicates assignment to the carrier Soryu. The appearance of the A5M in 1937 marked the emergence of the Imperial Japanese Navy as a modern force. The Claude only participated in one battle during World War Ii but assured its place in history in action in China.

Carlos Delgado had two models to show. His He 177 was built from the Revell kit and was in $1/72^{nd}$ scale. His other model was a Horton 129 in $1/48^{th}$ sale and was built from the Dragon kit.


Dixi Fischer had as a Work in Progress a 1/12th scale "Hedgehog Nest." The room was made from wood and all except the chair was handcrafted.


Steve Herren brought four items to show. The ship was the Spanish Galleon "San Mateo." The other three were built from Guns of History kits and included a US Civil War Gatling Gun, an ammunition caisson and an ambulance, all in 1/16th scale.

Five-year-old Vincien Kennedy brought a wooden 747 of unknown scale and hand painted.

Richard Macias bought a MiG 9 built from the Tamiya kit in 1/72nd scale.

Justin Segovia had two Crusader tanks, one a Mark II, the other a Mark III in 1/72nd scale.
