The March meeting was a contest meeting and we had 9 entries on the table. Those nine were divided into three categories. You might think that

with only nine entries and being divided into three categories, there was no competition involved. No so. **Mike Boudreaux** nosed out **Fabian Nevarez** for the First Place in Aircraft. Either model could have taken First in most any contest.

The results are as follows:

First Place, a 1/48th scale Yak 3 built by **Mike Boudreaux**, **Second Place** the Revell Lockheed PV-1 in 1/48th scale built by **Fabian Nevarez**. **Third Place**, a 1/72nd scale Me 321 Giant glider built by **Mike Garcia**. Charlie Flores brought three models. He had a Hobby Boss T6-G in 1/72nd scale in Chinese PL Air Force markings. He also had a Hobby Boss P-40E in 1/72nd scale built in Maj. Porkyszew of the 154 IAP, Leningrad Front, 1942. His third model was a 1:700 USS SSN-23 submarine also a Hobby Boss kit. Charlie has a pretty stressful job and he builds to relieve the stress. Nice work and it makes for more pleasant ends for the day's effort.


Don Fenton's 1/48th F4U-1D from Tamiya

This was a complete and informative presentation that was well received by the membership.

Michael King brought a couple of models to show. He had an Airfix J2F-5 "Duck" with a scratch built interior and marked in NAS Pensacola markings. Mike also had an A6M-5 model 52 Type "0" built I think, from the Academy kit in the First Kamikaze Squadron markings. Both models were in 1/72nd scale. Looking good.


