

I also saw one of the 20mm guns built as a single weapon, all in wood. In the same box were some parts that should be a Jeep at some time in the future. As you will find in the article, Dennis is an interesting modeler. His workmanship shows that he is a very talented modeler, as well.





Bill Plunk has returned after a short absence as his job takes him to various and sundry places. Bill had a PzKpw II, "Luchs" in 1/35 scale.

It was made from the Tusca kit. Bill also had the DML Loki 54 cm Morser, Geraet 041. This was a huge model in 1/35 scale.

Sticking with the armor side of the meeting, **John Estes** had thirteen various pieces in 1/72nd scale. Most were from the old ESCI series of kits and most needed decals and weathering. Roy Lingle had an M4A1 (76mm) wet, from Operation Cobra. This was the Dragon kit and was in 1/35 scale. It was nice to see Roy back at the meeting as he had hurt his back at his job and had missed a couple of months.


The El Paso Scale Model Society

Our club is a chartered chapter of the International Plastic Model Society - U.S. Branch (the IPMS-USA). The EPSMS was first organized in 1969, received its charter in 1970, and has been continuously active since that time.

We are a non-profit organization dedicated to promoting the art of scale modeling (regardless of construction media), and membership is open to anyone interested in scale modeling. Club membership dues are payable on an annual basis (we can accept cash or personal checks). Dues are \$15.00 per year for regular members over the age of 16, and are based on a January-December club year. Junior memberships are available for those aged 16 and under, and are priced at \$5.00 per year. Family memberships are available for an extra payment of \$2.00 per year per family member. Members in good standing are entitled to vote in all club matters, run for office, enter club contests, judge in all club contests, and receive a copy of the club's monthly newsletter. Hal's Hobby Warehouse on Bessemer in East El Paso also offers club members a discount on purchases of models and modeling materials. The exact discount is set on a sliding scale. Our club meetings are generally held on the 1 st or 2nd Sunday of each month at 2.00 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall of St. Paul's United Methodist Church at 7000 Edgemere Blvd (please see the map below). Schedule changes are published ahead of time in the newsletter. We normally hold either one or two model contests at each club meeting, one against a specific modeling or historical theme, and one that is an open competition for anything a modeler wishes to bring.

The aircraft guys made a strong showing with several nice models to show.

Gus Gonzalez brought his finished ESCI, A7E Corsair II in 1/48th scale. Gus spent a great deal of time doing a number of needed improvements to this kit. He almost gave up a number of times but decided to, as the Brits say, Make of go of it. He cut, resized, filled and sanded, added antennas, re-did the cockpit interior and cut down the seat and added various details as needed

in that area. He added taxi and landing lights, dropped the flaps and deflected the rudder and nose wheel. In all he made a number of major modifications to achieve a more scale appearance to the model, ending with some very nice work done on a difficult kit.

Jim Davis had four really nice 1/72nd scale models to show. Today was Saber day for Jim. He had the Academy F-86E, the Fujimi F-86F and a Hasegawa F-86D.

Jim Davis' fourth model was the XFJ-2 modified from the Academy E kit. Jim has become one of our most prolific modelers with something new and neat every month. This was an eye-catching set of very colorful models. A Well done to Jim, as usual.

Gervasio Damboriarena was back with a number of 1/48thscale kits. He had the Monogram P-39 and the ESCI Mirage III BR and a Mil Mi 24D built from the Revell kit. In 1/72 he had a Revell Fairey Gannet.

Anna Harth had a 1/6th scale Carousel Tiger that was carved from wood. This was another of Anna's efforts that had to be seen. She does a great job of many unusual subjects and all from scratch.

Jerry Wells had a SH-34J HT-8 in 1/72nd scale based on the Italeri kit and Jerry used the Cobra Cockpit parts to add detail. Jerry also had a JB-2 Loon which came from the Matcbox kit, which should be ex-Frog. The official designation at one time was KUW-1, which was later changed to LTV-

N-2. Most people know this thing as a buzz bomb.

Connie Harth brought the Pioneer 2, Beech AT-11 in 1/72nd scale. He also had another of his Hit Kit efforts. This model was a Schreck FBA-17 HMT-2 in Chinese

markings. This was a 1/72ndscale kit and for those who are not familiar with the kit, it is a flying boat. An unusual model to say the least.

Joseph Roper had a neat ship model down at the front end of the meeting hall. Many
