
# The El Paso Scale Model Society

Our club is a chartered chapter of the International Plastic Model Society - U.S. Branch (the IPMS-USA). The EPSMS was first organized in 1969, received its charter in 1970, and has been continuously active since that time.

We are a non-profit organization dedicated to promoting the art of scale modeling (regardless of construction media), and membership is open to anyone interested in scale modeling. Club membership dues are payable on an annual basis (we can accept cash or personal checks). Dues are \$15.00 per year for regular members over the age of 16, and are based on a January-December club year. Junior memberships are available for those aged 16 and under, and are priced at \$5.00 per year. Family memberships are available for an extra payment of \$2.00 per year per family member. Members in good standing are entitled to vote in all club matters, run for office, enter club contests, judge in all club contests, and receive a copy of the club's monthly newsletter. Hal's Hobby Warehouse on Bessemer in East El Paso also offers club members a discount on purchases of models and modeling materials. The exact discount is set on a sliding scale. Our club meetings are generally held on the 1 st or 2nd Sunday of each month at 2.00 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall of St. Paul's United Methodist Church at 7000 Edgemere Blvd (please see the map below). Schedule changes are published ahead of time in the newsletter. We normally hold either one or two model contests at each club meeting, one against a specific modeling or historical theme, and one that is an open competition for anything a modeler wishes to bring.

He made several improvements to two of the basic models like reshaping the nose profile, created new and corrected vacuuformed canopies, scratch-built new landing gear legs, wheels and tires, exhaust pipes, tail wheels spinner and prop blades, corrected wing dihedrals and finally repainted them in Bolivian Air Force colors and applied home-made decals. I am not familiar enough with the models to make any comments about them except they were big and looked pretty nice (*pictures below*).







Under construction, he had a Spitfire IX and his son **Brandon** had a Dodge vehicle to show. There was some interesting and different modeling going on here.

**Carlos Delgado**, another of the *Juarez* contingent, had a PM model of the Horten 229 on the table. Nice work and it reminded me that I still have one to get finished.

**Jim Davis** had an FJ-3 converted from an Emhar F4J and a Heller F-86 done up in trainer colors. It looked real nice from where I stood.

Anan Harth had a totem Pole from Ketchikan, Alaska. It was, as usual, hand carved by Anna and was based on a photo taken by the Harth's when visiting Alaska some years back. Anna told me what year she carved this piece but asked me not to tell.

Gervasio Damboriarena has several nice models to show. He had the Heller Alpha Jet in 1/50th scale and a Revell F4U-4 in 1/48th. On down the table, was a Hobbycraft CF100, Mk 4 and a Greek F4-E, both in 1/48th scale. Next to these was a Pakistani Nachang A-5 in 1/48th scale and a Monogram AT-37 in Dominica markings. Last but not least was a Pucara IA-58 in Uruguayan markings. Gervasio is not doing too bad in the new kit effort as all of these were new to me.

Carl Webster had an M-50 and an M-51 to show. The M-50 was a kit bash of a couple of Sherman types and the M-51 was the Israeli Isherman OTB from the Academy kit.

Andrew Basch brought several nice armor models to show. He had a Stug IV and a T-34 with 76mm gun from the Tamiya kits, a Challenger I based on the Tamiya kit and an Italeri M110 A-2 with 8 inch gun.


















a little thick and lacking detail. I also added a M2 .50 cal and cradle from a Legends model kit left over from a Taran 5 kit I'm working on. The mantlet looked a little naked because it doesn't have a mantlet cover so I used tissue soaked in a 50/50 mix of glue and water. I some trouble while mating the two turret pieces together. The halves didn't mate right at rear of the turret in the ballast area. It took a lot of holding, putting, and sanding to get it flush.

### The Upper Hull

The upper hull came from the Tamiya kit. The only parts for the upper hull that came the MP Models kit were the Cummins engine deck, rear hull plate, apu (axillery power unit) exhaust pipe, and the fender extender. The front fenders had to be cut off and replaced with new ones from the DML M4a3e8 kit (luckily it had an unneeded extra set). I had to do this because the Tamiya front fenders are for the vvss suspetion. I had to cut the side fender extenders to fit the shorter hull of the Tamiya hull. I used the MP Models IDF stowage for the sides and rear of the hull. For the front of the hull I installed the head lights, .30 cal ball turret, and add on armor to the drivers and co-drivers area.

I installed the Cummins engine deck but because it is made for the M4a4 hull I had to cut it to fit the shorter m4 hull flush with the back of the hull so I could add the rear hull plate.

### Introduction and history

The M-50 Super Sherman is a combined effort between the IDF and France. Using an M4 hull and turret and adding a French 76mm high velocity gun {the same gun used on the French AMX-30}. Most M-50s used the M4a4 stretched hull, but they did build it on nearly all of the other M4 hulls. If built on the other shorter hulls the had to add an extender to the rear of the hull to fit the Cummings engine. When delivered the French had the vvss suspension on the hull but some had the hvss of easy 8 suspension on them, but the Israeli's modified the vvss tanks to hvss. They also added a stowage box on each side, fuel cans, and spare road wheels to the sides. The French delivered the M-50s literally on the night before the start of the Six Day War, in witch they did very well against Arab Soviet built t-54s, 55s, and 62s.

This conversion project started out two very good kits. The first is the MP Models M-50 kit based on the M4a4 hull. The second was the Tamiya m4 early model kit. I also used the tracks from the Academy M-51 kit. I used many parts from my spares box also.

#### The Turret

I started out the conversion working on the turret. The turret is from the MP Models kit. The only change I made to the turret was to add antennas from the Tamiya. I liked the look of the Tamiya ones over the look of the MP Models ones, because the MP Models antennas
